

Vaccine Drug Schedules

As of July 1, 2026, all pharmacy professionals with approved training and in accordance with the terms, conditions and limitations set out in their certificate of registration are able to administer the following vaccines, or any combination thereof, to individuals 5 years of age or older (unless otherwise specified). These vaccines are listed in [Schedule 3 of Ontario Regulation 256/24](#) under the *Pharmacy Act, 1991*.

The list summarizes the drug schedules for the vaccines in Schedule 3 that are within scope to be administered by pharmacy professionals. Schedule II substances do not require a prescription to be dispensed while schedule I substances require a prescription to be dispensed.
